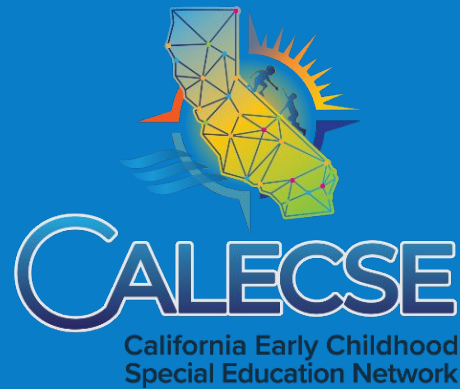

Operational Definition



Universal Design for Learning (UDL) is an educational framework based on research in the learning sciences that guides the development of flexible methods, materials and environments that embrace variability, minimize barriers, and develop learner agency for all.
