

RECOGNIZE, REFER, SUPPORT: CHILD FIND ESSENTIALS FOR COMMUNITY-BASED EARLY LEARNING PROGRAMS

Community-based early learning professionals are often among the first to recognize when a child may benefit from additional support. This no-cost, virtual training will strengthen participants' understanding of developmental milestones from birth through age five, early indicators of developmental concerns, and the Child Find process. Participants will learn about referral procedures, required timelines, and practical tools, including the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Milestone Tracker, to support observation, documentation, and collaborative partnerships with families and Local Educational Agencies (LEAs).
